# **Developing your policies**







Having appropriate policies and procedures in place, and communicating these effectively to everyone involved, will play an important role in the running of your club and help to protect club members and officers.

Use the checklist below to ensure you are taking the steps to develop the policies for your club;

Identify your policy needs
Research existing policies - there are lots of policy templates available online, organisations to start with include BWB, the CPSU, Ann Craft Trust and Club Matters
Adapt the policy to suit the needs of your club

Get sign off from your committee
Implement your policy – share it with your members and club staff;
Check the policies effectiveness – develop action plans, survey members, complete impact assessments
Review and update – policies aren't static documents, they should be regularly reviewed and updated to suit the changing needs of your club

### **Codes of conduct**





In order to establish and maintain an acceptable and quality club culture, standards of behaviour must be upheld by all within the club regardless of their role; committee members, coaching and volunteers, participants and/or spectators.

An important tool to assist you in setting those standards of behaviour are codes of conduct. Ideally, the codes of conduct would have involvement and input by all involved with your club ensuring that they are then 'bought in' to what is being set as the standards expected of them.

Codes of conduct should include:

- Committee Members
- Team Staff (volunteers, coaches, team managers, team followers)
- Participants (adult, junior)
- Parents and Carers
- Spectators

Your club, to go along with your club's code of conduct should have a club constitution in place. A club constitution is a simple document that outlines its functions and the rules under which it will operate. Having a constitution should help to clarify how club procedures work. You should, in an induction pack to each of your members provide them with a copy of your code of conduct and your club constitution.
